NEW BUSINESS:

Mayor Kitchell introduced Ross Anderson who recently started in the Clerk Treasurers office to announce the Bid winners for the Blight Elimination Program.

- Bid Winners Announced – Blight Elimination Program Ross Anderson
Ross stated that there are two houses: 413 North Cicott and 522 Fitch Street

that are being awarded to Freedom First Excavating LLC for demolition and greening. Stacy Cox stated that they along with the LMBC looked closely at both of the bids before choosing one and this one was significantly less money.

Motion: to approve awarding the bid to Freedom First Excavating, LLC, **Action:** Approve, **Moved by** Mayor Kitchell, **Seconded by** Carl McPherson.

- Hazvet, LLC – BEP hazardous waste removal Ross Anderson

This is a contract to go into the two Blight Elimination properties, 413 North Cicott and 522 Fitch Street, and remove everything that cannot be taken to the dump. They have been used in all previous BEP houses they have had.

Motion: to approve contract with Hazvet, LLC, **Action:** Approve, **Moved by** Mayor Kitchell, **Seconded by** Carl McPherson.

- GRW – Zoning Ordinance – Phase 3 Arin Shaver

This is a supplement to finish the needed changes. This request is for an additional \$2,000. Arin stated that this is already under contract and the changes deal with State changes and Case Law that have to happen with signage. They are also reformatting to make it easier for citizens and developers to read the Ordinance.

Motion: to approve the supplement to an agreement with GRW for zoning ordinance changes, **Action:** Approve, **Moved by** Carl McPherson, **Seconded by** Mercedes Brugh.

- BCA Environmental Consultants – Memorial Center Mercedes Brugh

This is for sampling and testing for asbestos at the Memorial Center. This will add 60 points to the CDBG grant application. The contract is not to exceed \$3,500. Mercedes stated that the County is going to pay half of this Contract.

Deb O'Connor stated that she received an email on June 30th from the National Veteran's Assistance Project. The email stated that the property had been given to them and they would like to fix it up. It also stated that they would be here within one week to 10 days. Nothing has been done as of today. Deb sent an email to the person who emailed her from the National Veteran's Assistance Project to let them know that the property was going before the BOW today and they did not respond. The property has not been changed on the property deed currently. The woman who is listed as the property owner has not responded to Deb at any point. The only thing saying that this property has been given to them is the email from them stating that. Yamir Gonzalez-Velez stated that they must attempt to give notice to the owner on record. If they cannot make contact, the city must proceed with the owner on record. This property was condemned in April. There are taxes and liens due on this property. Mayor Kitchell suggested demolishing the property. Stacy Cox suggested forgiving the City Liens on the property and seeing if she would be willing to put the property into the BEP. Stacy would like a little time to research the options.

Johnny reported that Mr. Berkshire is still in violation of multiple city codes. Johnny says that the tempered glass is not acceptable. Mayor Kitchell asked for Johnny's recommendation. The letters date back to April and we have seen very little progress. He does not believe 1 more week will be enough. Mayor says the best thing for Mr. Berkshire and the city is to order a property clean-up.
Motion: to order a property clean-up and bill the property owner, **Action:** Approve, **Moved by** Mayor Kitchell, **Seconded by** Mercedes Brugh.




