The Board of Public Works and Safety met for a regular meeting, Wednesday, October 21, 2009, at 5:00 p.m., in the City Chambers, 3rd floor, City Building, Logansport, Indiana.

New Business:

Mayor Fincher delivered Code Enforcer Officer Hileman's weekly report. The following address (es) is (are) recommended for the Logansport Street Department for cleanup at a rate of \$250.00 per hour plus a \$50.00 Administration and \$50.00 fine: -0-Recommendations and report passed on a vote of 3-0.

Building Commissioner Hostetler delivered his weekly report. The department has collected \$1,055.00 in various fees during the past week. The recommendation(s) and entire report is accepted on a vote of 3-0.


Mr. Homer Shafer was present to request the closing of parking spaces on the northwest corner of Clay and Grove Streets from October 22 until October 24 for the demolition of a home that he owns at 433 Grove Street. Permission was granted on a vote of 3-0.


Other Business:

Mayor Fincher submitted a claim for \$1,321.50 against the owners of Tipton School property for the removal of saplings and debris after complaints from area neighbors. The claim is a total of man-hours from both the cemetery and street department plus equipment. Deputy Attorney Lisa Traylor-Wolff will inform the owners. If payment is not received in a timely manner, the claim will become a lien against said property.

Deputy Mayor Klinck presented two letters from Jeff Murray stating that his tenants are responsible for infractions against City Ordinances related to trash. Deputy Attorney Lisa Traylor-Wolff said the law reads that the property owner is responsible as Mr. Murray has acknowledged in the past Board of Public Works and Safety meetings.
