

**ORDINANCE 2022-04**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOGANSPORT, INDIANA, AMENDING ORDINANCE 2016-39 IN ITS ENTIRETY AND ESTABLISHING THE FEES AND POLICIES PERTAINING TO MUNICIPALLY OWNED CEMETERIES, SPECIFICALLY MOUNT HOPE CEMETERY AND ALL ITS SECTIONS, AND THE NINTH STREET CEMETERY**

**WHEREAS**, The City of Logansport, ("City") is a duly formed municipal corporation within the State of Indiana, governed by its duly elected Mayor and Common Council ("Council"); and,

**WHEREAS**, it is the duty and the responsibility of the Council to consider and adopt legislation intended to facilitate the smooth operation of City government; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Common Council of the City approved Ordinance 2016-39, establishing the fees and policies pertaining to municipally owned cemeteries, specifically Mount Hope cemetery and all its sections, and the Ninth street cemetery; and

**WHEREAS** the Common Council of the City of Logansport, Indiana finds that changes in circumstances are such that Ordinance 2016-39 needs to be amended; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Common Council of the City of Logansport, Indiana meeting in session as follows:

**ARTICLE I. OPERATION**

**Sec. 7-1 General Provisions.**

- (A) **WORK DONE IN CEMETERIES:** It shall be unlawful for any person to dig any grave or make any other excavation, erect any burial vault monument, gravestone, marker, curb, coping, or structure of any character whatever, plant any tree, shrub, or other work in any cemetery owned, controlled by or committed to the custody of the City of Logansport, under the laws of the State of Indiana, except such work as is especially authorized by the Board of Public Works and Safety of the city or such work as may be generally authorized or required by the rules of said board and posted in and about such cemetery. All grave space owners desiring to

erect any burial vault, monument, gravestone, marker, curb, coping, fence, or other structure of any character or desiring to plant any tree or other substantial growth on their respective grave space, ordinary floral decorations excepted, or to cut or remove any tree or substantial growth on, or that may hereafter be planted on, their grave space or spaces, shall first obtain permission from the Cemetery Sexton, who shall authorize the proposed work or improvement if such work or improvement is in conformity with the city's ordinances and the rules and regulations promulgated by the City Board of Public Works and Safety. All required work shall be promptly completed according to said requirements and the applicant shall, upon completion of the work, restore the lot to its original condition consistent with such improvement and promptly remove from the cemetery all rubbish and refuse occasioned by it. If the Sexton denies any proposed improvement, the applicant to the Board of Public Works and Safety may appeal such denial. The Board of Public Works and Safety shall then set a time for a hearing on the Sexton's decision. The notice of intent to appeal must be filed within ten (10) days of the Sexton's decision or the right to appeal is waived.

The Cemetery Sexton shall have the right to remove or order to be removed shrubs or trees causing difficulty with maintenance or infringing upon other burial plots.

**(B) EMPLOYMENT OF SEXTON:** The Mayor is hereby authorized to appoint a Sexton who is to have supervisory charge of any such cemetery, to prescribe and define his duties.

In addition to the duties established by the Board of Public Works and Safety, it shall be the duty of the Sexton to report to said board all violations of the city's ordinances and violations of the board's rules and regulations that pertain to the cemeteries. The Common Council of the City of Logansport in a general salary ordinance shall set the Sexton's salary annually.

**(C) OPENING AND CLOSING OF GRAVES:** All graves for the interment of human remains shall be opened and closed by the Sexton or other employees of the cemetery unless the Sexton authorizes another person or firm to do the work. The Sexton may grant his/her approval for such excavation if he/she is reasonably satisfied that such charges including the charge for opening and closing the grave, will be promptly paid within a reasonable time after the grave's opening.

The size of the graves shall be 40 inches x 144 inches except for those in Highland 7<sup>th</sup> which will be 44 inches x 144 inches . Memorial Gardens will be 42 inches x 132 inches. Some rows are not 12 ft. long.

(D) PERPETUAL CARE: The City shall provide for all lot owners, perpetual care, which shall consist of, but is not limited to, cutting grass and noxious growths; removal of rubbish and Jitter; keeping graves properly leveled and filled; seeding of graves; and performing all other work that shall be deemed necessary to meet the maintenance requirements and rules as established by the Logansport Board of Public Works and Safety. All grave spaces in Mount Hope and Ninth Street Cemeteries are provided perpetual care.

(E) CEMETERY RECORD: The Clerk-Treasurer of the city shall prepare and at all times keep in his/her office a book to be called "CEMETERY BOOK" in which shall be entered and kept a separate accounting of all cemetery lots of cemeteries owned or committed to the control of the city and shall make and enter therein all credits for the maintenance thereof.

(F) FORMULATING RULES AND REGULATIONS: The Board of Public Works and Safety of the city is hereby authorized from time to time to adopt and promulgate administrative rules and regulations, not inconsistent with the laws of the state and the ordinances of the City of Logansport, for the control and management of all public cemeteries belonging to the city, or committed to its custody, by the laws of the State of Indiana. Such rules and regulations, which so adopted and posted in a plain, legible, and conspicuous manner at the entrance of any cemetery, shall be binding and effective on all persons affected thereby the same as if fully incorporated in this section and the violation of any such rule or rules shall be subject to the penalties herein prescribed.

(G) BURIALS REGULATED: No interment of human remains shall be made within the city, except on the regular burial grounds already established, or hereafter established, or hereafter established, for such purpose and any person who shall enter such cemetery or burial grounds and inter any body without the authority and permit duly issued, as authorized by law, shall be deemed guilty of an infraction and subject to the penalties for the violation of this section.

(H) DEFACING CEMETERIES: It shall be unlawful for any person to wantonly, carelessly, or maliciously alter, deface, break down, or destroy, or in any other way deface any vault, monument, gravestone, marker, curbing, coping, fence railing or post thereof, erected or maintained around any lot or graves of deceased persons in and public or private cemetery or burial grounds in said city or shall in like manner remove or injure any tree, shrub, plant, floral decorations, or sodding in such cemetery or burial grounds.

(I) PLACING OF MONUMENTS: Permission for the erection or placement of any monument or grave marker shall be given upon payment of all charges due the City of Logansport, Indiana with respect to the involved grave spaces. Monuments must be placed on foundations substantial enough to carry the weight of the stone. A five (5) inch border shall be required. The City of Logansport shall not be responsible for the foundation or the stone after placement.

(J) BURIAL VAULTS: A burial vault constructed of metal, fiberglass, concrete, or other similar substance must be provided for each interment. Plastic vaults may be used in Baby Walk only.

(K) CONDUCT IN CEMETERIES: No obscene language or loud or profane conversation shall be allowed and no alcoholic beverage will be allowed within the municipally owned cemeteries. No motor vehicles shall be left unattended while the engine is in operation. No vehicle, except cemetery and monument vehicles performing their duties shall be driven on or over the lawns of such cemetery, or at any other place other than on the driveways thereof, and no vehicle shall be driven faster than ten (10) miles per hour. The driveways shall only be used for cemetery purposes and shall not be resorted to for commercial use or other use having no connection with cemetery purposes. No firearms shall be discharged within the cemetery except at military funerals. No person or persons shall use any such cemetery for other than cemetery purposes. No litter, rubbish, or other refuse shall be carried or deposited within the confines of any such cemetery by any person. No interference with the Sexton or other delegated with the personal charge in the performance of duties in or with reference to such cemetery shall be permitted.

(L) CHAPEL POLICY: The chapel will be made available to all local funeral homes for a time period of one (1) hour free of charge. Any times over the one (1) hour will be charged the rate of one-hundred (\$100.00) dollars per hour. This rule is to be enforced stringently. Five minutes over the hour will be charged for a half- hour at a rate of Fifty (\$50.00) dollars. Any out of town funeral home or private individual wishing to use the chapel will be charged one-hundred (\$100.00) dollars per hour. The same rules will apply to times over the hour. However, when two (2) requests for the use of the chapel are made for the same time, the Cemetery Sexton will decide who will use the chapel.

(M) BURIAL RESTRICTIONS: Burials shall be restricted to human remains only. The number of burials that shall be allowed on one gravesite shall be limited to one of the following choices: (1) one full interment; (2) one full interment and two cremations; (3) one full interment and two babies; (4) one full interment, one baby and two cremations; (5) six cremations.

(N) PENALTY: Any person violating any provision of this section or the rules adopted by the Board of Public Works and Safety as herein provided shall, upon conviction be fined in any sum not exceeding \$500 to which shall be added to costs of prosecution.

(O) CEMETERY HOURS AND HOLIDAYS: Cemetery hours will be from 6:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. daily with prevailing time zone.

All municipality owned cemeteries will observe the following holidays each year:

New Year's Day

Good Friday

Memorial Day  
Independence day  
Labor Day  
Veterans Day  
Thanksgiving Day  
Day after Thanksgiving  
Christmas Eve Day  
Christmas Day

(P) FLOWERS: All flowers will to be removed from new graves after 7 days from the date of burial unless the owner or person in charge of the grave notifies the Cemetery Sexton.

## **ARTICLE II. FEES**

Sec. 7-11 Charges for Plots, Care, Maintenance, Etc.

(A) COST OF GRAVE SPACE: The cost of each grave space in the cemetery (except for Highland 7th) owned or controlled by the city shall be as follows:

**2022 = \$800**

The cost of each grave space in Highland 7<sup>th</sup> will be:

**2022 = \$1,085**

*The price for graves in Highland Seventh includes foundation for headstones or markers.*

20% of the purchase price of each grave space shall be used exclusively for the perpetual care of the grave space, and such sum shall be deposited in the Cemetery Perpetual Fund.

(B) OPENING AND CLOSING GRAVES: The function of opening and closing of all graves, including seeding of said graves, shall be the responsibility of the City of Logansport. Fees for such service shall be as follows:

A child interred in a burial container (vault) up to thirty-six (36) inches may be placed on a grave space owned by a member of the family, at the head or foot of the grave space for charges specified in this section. The fee for interment in Baby Walk will be as follows:

**2022 = \$285**

**\*There will be an additional charge of \$100 after 3:00 p.m.**

(2) If the burial be that of an individual for whom a burial allowance is payable by a county department of public welfare and/or Medicaid approved, the cost shall be the maximum allowance authorized by law, but in no event shall such charges be less than:

**2022**

Welfare burial on weekdays	\$335
Welfare burial on weekends & holidays	\$510

**\*There will be an additional charge of \$100 after 3:00 p.m.**

BURIAL OF CREMAINS: The charge for the burial of cremations shall be as follows:

**\*There will be an additional charge of \$100 after 3:00 p.m.**

(D) COST OF MOUNT HOPE MAUSOLEUM CRYPTS: The charge for each cryptspace in a mausoleum for 2022 shall be \$3550.

The Mausoleum crypts are cemetery owned or controlled by the city. The cost of the crypts shall be deposited into the Cemetery Endowment Fund. Two hundred (\$200) dollars of the purchase price of each crypt space shall be used exclusively for the perpetual care of the city mausoleum.

(1) OPENING AND CLOSING CRYPTS: The function of opening and closing of all crypts shall be the responsibility of the City of Logansport. Fees for such services shall be as follows:

Resident Monday-Friday \$270, Saturday \$300, Sundays & Holidays \$325  
Non-Resident Monday-Friday \$340, Saturday \$375, Sundays & Holidays \$410

**\*There will be an additional charge of \$100 after 3:00 p.m.**

The name and date lettering of the crypt shall be the responsibility of the owner of said crypt.

(2) CREMAINS RESTRICTIONS: Burials shall be restricted to human remains only. The number of burials in each crypt shall be limited to one of the following: (a) One full entombment in one crypt.

(b) One full entombment and two cremations in one crypt.

(c) No entombments but up to six cremations in one crypt.

(E) ENTOMBMENT AND INTERMENT - NICHE COLUMBARIUM: The charge for the Niche Columbarium shall be as follows:

2022 = \$970

The cost of the Niche Columbarium shall be deposited into the Cemetery Endowment Fund. Fifty (\$50) dollars of the purchase price of each Niche Columbarium shall be used exclusively for the perpetual care of the columbarium.

The fees for opening and closing the niche shall be as follows:

2022

Monday through Friday Resident	\$100
Monday through Friday Non-Resident	\$115
Saturday Resident	\$120
Saturday Non-Resident	\$140
Sunday & Observed Holidays Resident	\$140
Sunday & Observed Holidays Non-Resident	\$155

**\*There will be an additional charge of \$100 after 3:00 p.m.**

Only one interment will be allowed per Niche. The name and date lettering of the Niche shall be the responsibility of the owner of said Niche.

(F) MILITARY MARKERS: Fees shall be paid by the county to a person to be designated by the Cemetery Sexton.

(G) DISINTERMENT OF A BODY: There will be a flat fee of \$1,200 for the disinterment of a body. The entity ordering the disinterment of a body will be responsible for any cost incurred relating to the vault company or any other company needed for the opening/closing of said grave. Disinterment of ashes or infant will match the interment fees and regulations, inclusive of the baby walk.

(H) PRIVATELY OWNED MAUSOLEUM OPENING: The following are The charges for the opening of a privately-owned mausoleum.

2022

**Residents:** Monday-Friday:\$270, Saturday:\$300, Sunday-Holiday: \$325 **Non-Resident:** Monday-Friday:\$340, Saturday:\$375, Sunday-Holiday: \$410

**\*There will be an additional charge of \$100 after 3p.m.**



(I) BACKHOE/OPERATOR USE: There shall be a charge of One hundred twenty five (\$125) dollars for the first hour of use of the backhoe and its operator for circumstances unrelated to the burial or disinterment of a body. The charge shall be One hundred twenty five (\$125) dollars for each additional hour or fraction thereof.

(A) METHOD OF PAYMENT: All payments required hereunder shall be made to the Clerk-Treasurer of the City of Logansport, Indiana. The payments made for perpetual care shall be deposited in the Cemetery Endowment Fund of the City of Logansport.

### ARTICLE III. MISCELLANEOUS RULES & REGULATIONS

Sec. 7-21 Refreshment Stands in Cemeteries

(A) PROHIBITED. The erection of refreshment stands and the sale of soft drinks, confectionery, and refreshments in and upon cemeteries within the corporate limits of the City of Logansport is, and the same is hereby prohibited.

(B) PENALTY. Any person violating this section shall upon conviction thereof be fined in any sum not exceeding ten (\$10.00) dollars, to which shall be added to the cost of the prosecution.

Sec. 7-22. This ordinance must be reviewed after its adoption every three (3) years by the Cemetery Sexton and the Board of Public Works and Safety with a report made to the City Council.

(C) EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor of the City of Logansport, Indiana.
